COVID UPDATE

Session and the Health Ministry Committee have closely followed CDC recommendations regarding pandemic restrictions for the past two years. Under recently revised metrics for community spread, Kalamazoo County is classified Medium, with guidelines as follows:

- If you are at high risk for severe illness, consult a healthcare provider about your need to wear a mask, and other precautions.
- Stay up to date with COVID-19 vaccines, and get tested if you have symptoms.
- People with symptoms, a positive test, or known exposure to someone with COVID-19 should follow CDC guidelines for self-isolation.

Following these guidelines, Session no longer mandates mask wearing in our building. We urge doing so if any of the above considerations are true for you. Anyone is always welcome to wear a mask at any time—it remains a leading way to prevent infection. By consensus of participants, the choir will continue to wear masks while singing, as will people in the nursery and Sunday School. Please respect those whose circumstances may differ from your own.

Pastor Seth Weeldreyer will lead reflection on John Bell's book, *Living with the Psalms*. Bell writes: "I have developed an affection for poems that Jesus knew and quoted which, for reasons of their bleakness, as well as their grandeur, have blessed the most unsuspecting of people. ... If God is God, and Scripture is deep, we should not expect the intellect to be the only conduit to understanding. ... I now believe emotion, experience, and imagination are also tools by which we can discover a relationship between our lives and Biblical texts." Along with a six-week outline in the back of the book for sampling the Psalms in daily prayer, here's a schedule for our discussion:


