

A MINUTE IN MINISTRY

It's common to ask what we're giving up for Lent. It's not a bad question. What's intended, though? Knowing who we are includes, in part, clarifying who or what we're not. Trying to live in a particular way often means choosing not to do other things. That's commitment and discipline. And ultimately, faithfully, it's always directed at possibility—what we can be; how we can live more abundantly. What are we giving up for Lent? Well, if it's a spirit of punishment for guilt, then nothing, I hope. Chocolate or sweet rolls ... okay, if our physical health could use more nutritious attention. Social media or other entertainment ... okay, if our mental and emotional health could use more hopeful attention. Sarcasm, criticism, negativity ... okay, if our relationships could use more loving attention.

Maybe it's helpful to ask: "What are we going to *take on* for Lent?" To center our hearts in Holy Love. To orient perceptions and perspectives by seeking goodness around us in others and the world. To live generously, attending to others' needs more than our own. When we identify what we feel called to do, then ask what could be prioritized more with our time, mental attention, physical effort, or whatever other resources; and thereby what won't be as much. We fast so that we can cherish ways we feast. We treasure certain gifts and resources so that we can make good choices about how to use them. More than obligation, I hope we can frame the season ahead as an invitation to pursue what will help us live more deeply, graciously, generously, abundantly, peace-fully.

During Lent this year, some resources we're using in worship and faith formation center on the theme, "Full to the Brim." This bundle of sanctified art, liturgy, daily reflections and more invites us to move from a scarcity mentality, injustice, and empty rhythms/ rituals, into a more expansive living faith, flowing from who we are most authentically. "When we allow ourselves to be filled to the brim with God's lavish love, that love spills over. It reaches beyond ourselves; like water, it rushes and flows, touching everything in its path."

We could begin answering this invitation by asking, "What brings me joy and makes me feel more fully alive?" It could be a creative activity—art, photography, music, poetry, theatre. It could be time with other people—friends, family, new acquaintances. It could be more personal time—reading, walking in nature, working around home, watching a movie, gardening (well, right now, maybe planning / dreaming!). Beyond duties, once we identify what makes us feel joyful and alive, then consider how to build on that strength and nurture that vitality even more.

Many of us find reading helpful for inspiring heart and mind. If so, for Lent, here's one book to consider: *Where the Eye Alights: Phrases for the Forty Days of Lent*, by Marilyn McEntyre. Marilyn offers short reflections (2-3 small pages) as a daily meditation on whatever came to mind for her in early morning quiet—"Remember that you are dust ...", "going about our business", "love in the open hand", "where we walk", "riding on the wind" ... you get the idea. Or maybe one of the many other offerings included in this newsletter may catch your heart and mind.

Many of us find that active service to others helps us see and receive grace in the world around us, as much as what we give. Is there a way you've thought of volunteering at church or in our community, and now could make the next step? Where could your passions and experiences meet needs we see?

However we relate with friends and family, as we emerge from Covid distancing and feel fractures in society, please invest in ways to connect, to listen, to love those we cherish or find more difficult—all who are created in Holy Love, as divine children, deserving dignified respect ... whom God wants to live abundantly.

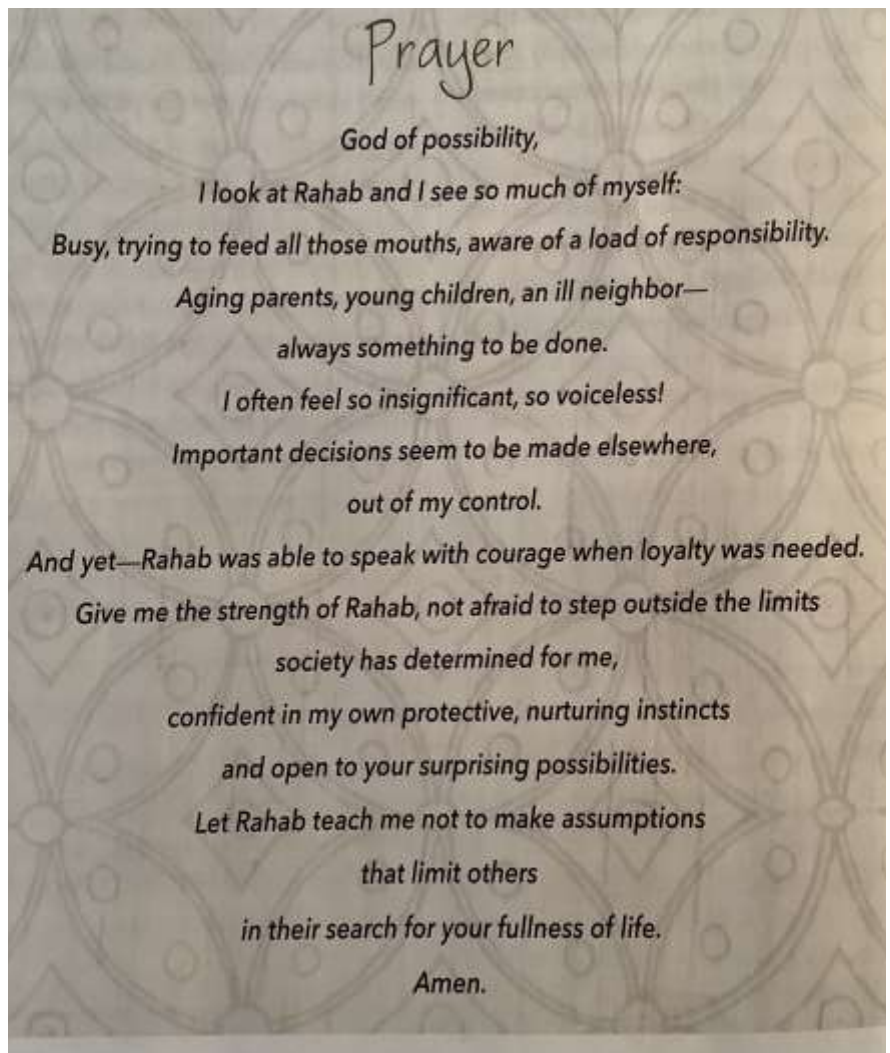

LENTEN BIBLE STUDY: AT ONE WITH THE ATONEMENT: THEOLOGIES OF THE CROSS

LIVING WITH THE PSALMS

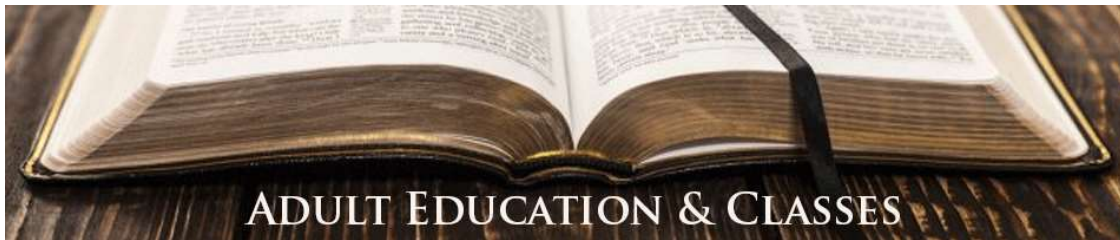
Tuesdays, March 1 – April 12 at noon, meeting in the Library

Pastor Seth Weeldreyer will lead reflection on John Bell’s book *Living with the Psalms*. Bell writes: “I have developed an affection for poems that Jesus knew and quoted which, for reasons of their bleakness as well as their grandeur, have blessed the most unsuspecting of people. ... If God is God, and Scripture is deep, we should not expect the intellect to be the only conduit to understanding. ... I now believe emotion, experience, and imagination are also tools by which we can discover a relationship between our lives and Biblical texts.” Along with a six-week outline in the back of the book for sampling the Psalms in daily prayer, here’s a schedule for our discussion:
